- Executive Director, Ferzan M. Ahmed, P.E.
  - Reported that the inspections of snowplow trucks and snow and ice equipment at all eight maintenance locations completed the week of October 21, 2024. The fleet is ready for the winter weather.
  - Shared video regarding Snow and Ice inspections.
  - Provided update on Toll Collection System:

Chief Engineer/Deputy Executive Director and his staff proposed the following resolutions.

Secretary-Treasurer Coviello asked about the bids and commented that they were under estimate and asked if this is a reversal of the trends the Commission has previously seen with few bids and those bids being over the estimated cost?

Chief Engineer/Deputy Executive Director Matta responded that the Commission attempts to get the projects out early so the contractors are still hungry for the next year's work and the amount of bids received are very good indicators of the way things are trending.

Chief Engineer/Deputy Executive Director Matta stated that prices for materials the Commission uses, such as guardrail, has come down significantly compared to last several years.

Chief Engineer/Deputy Executive Director Matta commented that by rebidding this project as a result of the bids previously received for the same project, the Commission is saving approximately \$4 million.

Commission Member Shay Murray asked what is a <u>"temporary access deduct alternate proposal"</u>, which she noted none of the contractors bid on.

Chief Engineer/Deputy Executive Director Matta explained that language is in all resurfacing projects, and it pertains to access to the jobsite and the use of non-revenue transponders for traveling to and from jobsites, hauling materials, etc. Contractors may have agreements with adjacent landowners to cut through their property to save on fuel and labor charges.

Chief Financial Officer, Lisa Mejac, provided an update on the October 2024 Traffic and Revenue reviewed and submitted (attached).

## **OHIO STATE HIGHWAY PATROL'S REPORT:**

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- Staff Lieutenant Richard Reeder reported on the following:
  - On October 18, 2024, at approximately 1305 hours, a Trooper from the Cleveland Post attempted to initiate a traffic stop on I-90 near Rocky River. The vehicle he attempted to stop for a speed violation was a white Ford Flex bearing no visible registration. Upon activating his overhead lights, the vehicle fled westbound at a high rate of speed exceeding 100 MPH and driving reckless. The vehicle exited at S.R. 611 and was observed running through a red light when the pursuit was terminated due to the disregard of others from the fleeing vehicle.

At 1323 hours a witness to the pursuit contacted Cleveland Dispatch to notify them of the suspect vehicle entering the Ohio Turnpike westbound at Milepost 142. Trooper Beyer immediately located the suspect vehicle and he began to follow at normal speeds while waiting for units ahead to setup for another possible pursuit. Trooper Lopez, of the Milan Post, was stationary in the crossover at Milepost 127 to initiate a traffic stop of the suspect vehicle. As he exited the crossover the suspect vehicle began to increase his speed in excess of 80 MPH and was in and out of traffic. Trooper McCoy, of the Milan Post, successfully deployed stop sticks at Milepost 117 but the suspect vehicle continued westbound until reaching a work zone near Milepost 82. Upon entering the zone, the driver drove in between barrels into the closed portion to traffic. Upon reaching a dead end, the driver abruptly stopped and struck a guard rail, exited the vehicle and fled on foot. He was quickly apprehended by Trooper Konrad, of the Swanton Post. Once secured, a loaded .380 Ruger pistol was located in his right front pocket. Additional ammunition was located in his left front pocket.

Secretary Treasurer Coviello asked the range of the taser.

Staff Lieutenant Reeder answered the tasers are up to twenty-five feet and there are two separate deployments that can be used without reloading.

Staff Lieutenant Reeder explained how the tasers work and their usefulness to law enforcement.

- Trooper Ann Geer has been nominated as the Swanton Post Trooper of the Year for 2024. Ann was also selected as the Findlay District Trooper of the Year and will now be considered for the State of Ohio Trooper of the Year award. Trooper Geer joined the Division in September of 2003 as part of the 141<sup>st</sup> Academy class. Her twentyone years of service has developed her into a well-roundedcompetent and reliable asset of the Swanton Post which she has been a part of since May of 2022. Trooper Geer is well respected by her peers and supervisors and she has fostered a great working relationship with the local agencies and the Ohio Turnpike.
- Trooper Andrew Lash has been nominated as the Milan Post Trooper of the Year for 2024. He was selected by his peers to represent the Post where he serves as a mentor to other units for his knowledge and guidance. This is Andrew's third year in a row to receive this award. Andrew joined the Division in July of 2019 as part of the 166<sup>th</sup> Academy class. He has spent his entire career at the Milan Post. Trooper Lash is once again the post leader in Criminal Patrol enforcement and is among the leaders in the Bucyrus District.

Trooper Lash and his wife Aubrey are proud supporters of the Northeast Ohio Foundation for Patriotism (NEOPAT), which is dedicated to promoting patriotism and remembering those who have gone before us. Additionally, Trooper Lash is involved with the Perry Thomas Demming Foundation (PTDF), which serves and honors those who have served or nation. Both of these organizations provide therapeutic outdoor activities which are effective in decreasing the symptoms of PTSD and helping Veterans transition to civilian life.

• Trooper Andrew Sliwoski from the Hiram Post was nominated as Hiram Post Trooper of the Year for 2024. Trooper Sliwoski is also a member of Class 166, graduating from the Academy on January 17, 2020. He is a member of the Mobile Field Force. Trooper Sliwoski is a big asset to the Hiram Post and an all-around great Trooper.

Chairman Hruby congratulated everyone and expressed his appreciation for the work of the Ohio State Highway Patrol. He also commented on the chases and dangerous work performed by members of the law enforcement community.

Staff Lieutenant Reeder commented on the changes in laws and the constant training needed to stay on top of things and make things better.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Turnpike and Infrastructure Commission ("Commission") published a notice in accordance with law advertising an Invitation to Bid on a Contract for Bridge Deck Replacement and Rehabilitation, Pyle South Amherst Road (C.R. 16) over the Ohio Turnpike at Milepost 138.7 and West Ridge Road (C.R. 53) over the Ohio Turnpike at Milepost 142.6, Lorain County, Ohio, and designated as Project No. 43-25-04 (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Commission received five (5) bids to perform the contractor's obligations on the Project, and the report of the Commission's Chief Engineer/Deputy Executive Director concerning the review and analysis of the bid is before the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Equity and Inclusion found that Suburban Maintenance made a good faith effort to attain the participation of small or otherwise disadvantaged businesses on the Project and has made a SBE commitment of 13%, which exceeds the SBE participation goal of 10% for this Project; and

WHEREAS, Commission action is necessary to approve the Contract in accordance with Article V, Section 1.00 of the Commission's Bylaws because the amount of the bids received will require expenditures under the Project that will exceed \$150,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Engineer/Deputy Executive Director recommends the Commission select Suburban Maintenance as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director concurs with the Chief Engineer/Deputy Executive Director's recommendation that the Commission approve the award of the Project to Suburban Maintenance as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has duly considered such recommendations.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, by the Ohio Turnpike and Infrastructure Commission that the bid of Suburban Maintenance and Construction, Inc. for Project No. 43-25-04 in the amount of \$3,886,632.30 is approved as the lowest responsive and responsible bid received and the Executive Director is authorized to execute a contract based on said bid.

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Resolution No. 84-2023</u>, adopted September 18, 2023, the Executive Director of the Ohio Turnpike and Infrastructure Commission ("Commission") is authorized to participate in state contracts through the Ohio Department of Administrative Services ("DAS") Cooperative Purchasing Program, through which members may purchase supplies, services, equipment and other materials in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 125.04; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>Resolution No. 57-2018</u>, adopted September 17, 2018, the Ohio Turnpike and Infrastructure Commission ("Commission") approved an agreement with Agile Network Builders, LLC ("Agile") for: (1) internet circuits which provide the Commission's connectivity to the State of Ohio Multi-Agency Radio Communication System ("MARCS") network; (2) redundancy to the Commission's fiber optic network; (3) Public Wi-Fi at the Commission's Service Plazas; and, (4) management services for these networks under the Ohio Department of Administrative Services ("DAS") Cooperative Purchasing Program, Master Services Agreement No. 0026 ("MSA0026"), for a five-year period in the not-to-exceed amount of \$1,868,814.20 which is set to expire later this month; and

WHEREAS, Agile submitted a renewal quote under DAS MSA0026, dated November 4, 2024, for a five-year period, in the not-to-exceed amount of \$1,811,880.00, which maintains the current monthly fee and provides (1) increased bandwidth on the circuits which will improve the Commission's redundancy capabilities in the event of fiber optic damage and improve the speed of the public Wi-Fi at the Service Plazas; (2) primary and secondary connect circuits required for MARCS; and (3) the circuit to OARnet required for the Commission's CBTS phone system, which the Chief Information Officer recommends the Commission approve; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director has reviewed the recommendation of Chief Information Officer and concurs that the Commission should approve the new five (5) year agreement with Agile; and

WHEREAS, Commission action is necessary under Article V, Section 1.00 of the Commission's Code of Bylaws because the expenditure exceeds \$150,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has duly considered such recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED by the Ohio Turnpike and Infrastructure Commission that a new agreement with Agile Network Builders, LLC to provide redundant fiberoptic cable connectivity, public WiFi internet access and network management services for a five-year period, including increased bandwidth on the circuits which will improve the Commission's redundancy capabilities in the event of fiber optic damage and improve the speed of the public Wi-Fi at the Service Plazas; primary and secondary connect circuits required for MARCS and the circuit to OARnet required for the Commission's CBTS phone system, under DAS MSA0026, as described in the proposal dated November 4, 2024, in the total amount of \$1,811,880.00, is approved.
